FOR THOSE WHO JOINED ACBL AFTER JANUARY 1, 2010

These rules apply to you if you joined the ACBL after January 1, 2010 or reinstated your membership after that date.

Advanced NABC Master 300 (at least 50 black, 50 silver, 50 red or gold/platinum,

of which at least 25 must be gold/platinum)

Life Master 500 (at least 75 black, 75 silver, 100 red or gold/platinum,

of which at least 50 must be gold/platinum)

Bronze Life Master A Life Master with 750

A Life Master with 1000 (at least 200 silver, red, gold or platinum)

This deal occurred at Bob Munson's men's group, a once a month 2 table imp game where you play 4 hands with each expert and then switch partners.

At my table, East was the dealer and the bidding went P,P,1D,P, 2C, X, 2N, P, 3N.

The opening lead was the J of Spades and I(South) thought that declarer had 3 or 4 spades so I ducked and declarer won their Q, led a diamond to the J followed by a club to the J and then ran 4 more clubs before leading the Q of Hearts which I covered and they claimed making 10 tricks.

At the other table the bidding went P, P, 1D, P, 2N, P, 3N. and my hand led the 2 of Hearts and that declarer won the J, finessed the J of Clubs, then led to the J of Diamonds and ran 4 more clubs and claimed making 9 tricks.

There were several errors at both tables in my opinion:

First, at my table I could have seen that we were not going to set 3N unless we ran 5 spades so I should not have ducked the opening lead. I also feel that my partner should have led the 3 of Spades because count (length) is more important than showing nothing higher than the J. with the 2N bid, it is not likely that you would be leading through an honor. Of course West probably should not have bid 2N without a Spade stopper when my takeout double is promising strong majors.

Second (or is this third), at the other table the opening lead from my hand was the 2 of Hearts but should have been a high spade and then North would have signaled with the J and the suit would have been cached out. If North didn't like spades South still could shift to another suit.

Bridge is always interesting as here when the par result is -120 and at both tables it was -400 or -430. This result at any form of scoring would be very good.
