All four agreed that bridge table real estate is at a premium. Beverage containers (open or closed) can be put on the floor along food items. OK for bridge records to be on the table. A while ago, I remember a player, at a past Regional, who kept a newspaper on the table (dummy cards were placed on top). Definitely not endearing to the other players.



The other item identified was 'time wasted' before the opening lead. Some players take their time to record the contract and other items before reviewing their hand and leading. The four accomplished players, mentioned above, felt that this was inconsiderate and wasted the other three players' time. Lead first and then record contract and other information.

# Play a Hand with Me

This bidding can be explained by the fact that my partner and I play a response to a 2C opening bid is as follows: 2D =0 or 1 control with a hand that has less than 5 points, 2H=0 or 1 control and values for game (6+), 2S = 2 controls and 2N = 3 controls, etc. Controls are counted as a K = 1 and an A = 2. My 3D was a transfer and when I raised to 4H I was making a slam invitation and of course my partner wanted to be in slam so she bid it.

The opening lead was the Q of diamonds and she won the K. At this point it appears that the slam would make if the A clubs was onside but the bidding indicated that this was not the case. Assuming the Q diamonds was from the Q and J, she led all of the hearts followed by the 3 top spades coming down to a diamond in dummy along with 2 clubs. She had the A and 10 diamonds in her hand along with the singleton K clubs. West was forced to save the J and 7 diamonds and therefore the singleton A clubs so she led her club and he had to lead into her A and 10 diamonds, making 6. Note here, she needed to watch Wests discards very carefully because he could have discarded differently.

I feel that there are times when you do not want to give away information as a defender and on this hand I am sure West wished he hadn't.

As an aside, playing with my other partners I would have responded 2H showing an A or 2 K's and then East would have led a club which would have set us.

Sometimes a system along with luck helps you get a good board.


Classes given by Carol Griffin are starting the second week in Jan 2023

#### March News

CCBC is making a change to its Tuesday games. See below for more details.

CCBC continues its hybrid schedule with bridge games in person in Orinda and on-line on BBO. ACBL is reinstating the ACBL-wide games and charity games for in-person clubs in 2023, so there will be many opportunities in the coming year for extra MPs. There will also frequently be 1 week per month of special games **on-line** with extra MPs

CCBC is now hosting games on Mondays (open at 11:15), Tuesdays (299er at 10:00) and Thursdays (999er at 10:30) at the Orinda Masonic Hall, 9 Altarinda Road. Games continue on BBO on Wednesday (open at 10:00) and Friday (open at 10:00).

Schedule changes: Effective March 1 - Tuesday's 10 AM bridge game in Orinda will be changed to a 299'er game. This change will allow more players the opportunity to play in person, while continuing CCBC's efforts to appeal to the area's newest players.

The game will have the following features:

- 1) A mini-lesson will precede each game, with a review of a couple of hands from the prior week.
- 2) 18 boards will typically be played.
- 3) Each player will have the opportunity to ask 2 bidding questions during the game.
- 4) Games will be stratified by Master Point level; so players are competing with others with comparable experience.
- 5) A player may come with a partner or as a single. (Singles can count on being matched with a partner.)
- 6) Mentoring will be encouraged. An experienced player in the 200-299 MP range playing with one in the 0-50 range will play for <u>free</u>.

Tuesday's 749'er online game will be cancelled.

**Special games in March** – The week of **March 13-19**, we will have club championship games for all in-person games. Lots of extra MPs with no extra charge!

#### SINGLE TOPIC SEMINARS - MONDAYS 1-3pm

The Topics listed below are touched upon in the two ACBL texts:

- (1) Commonly Used Conventions (CUC)
- (2) More Commonly Used Conventions MCUC. With each of the below dates we have referred to the chapter and page of the appropriate text.
- March 6: Stayman (advanced); CUC Chapter 1, page 5.
- March 13: Jacoby Transfers; CUC Chapter 2, page 36.
- March 20: Jacoby 2NT; CUC Chapter 3, page 78
- March 27: Support Doubles and Redoubles; MCUC Chapter 2.
- April 3: Strong 2C Opener; systems for responding. This session will focus on Standard American responses. CUC Chapter 8, page 260.
- April 10: Strong 2C Opener; Control Responses; it is my favorite, and I think the most effective; not covered in the textbooks.
- April 17: Interfering over 1NT opening bid; Cappelletti which is very basic and has very little wriggle room in how to implement. In our general area there are other conventions that are quite popular, and, it is to your benefit to become familiar with these other conventions for when they are used against you; no textbook details.
- April 24: Interfering over the opponent's 1NT opening; DONT (Disturbing Opponent's Notrump) and TNT (Touching-Not-Touching); no textbook details.
- May 1: You are responder and partner opens 1NT and RHO interferes; what are your options; no textbook details.
