First of all, there have been some abusive phone calls to current bridge players. That has led to the Online Directory being disabled and a search for ways to increase the security of sensitive info on the U499 Web site. A subcommittee of the Board is reviewing some software to enhance our website and to increase the security. More on this to come.



Secondly, there was discussion about the Board gifting to charities. The Board recognizes the value of gifting to the local community. Our Bylaws (available on the U499 Web Site) specifically state the purpose of the Board is to 'Promote and expand bridge membership and activities'. The Directors have a duty and obligation to follow the Bylaws. The Bylaws can be changed and/or amended (see the Bylaws for the process).

- □□ The Board is reviewing ways to work with clubs to make gifting to charities, clubs may have the flexibility for gifting
- □□ Seminars from reputable bridge experts.

Finally, I welcome bridge players who want to contribute to the U499 bridge community to check with me about how they can participate to make the clubs better.

I was North on this deal and my partner visualized a dummy that would have fitting cards after I made a negative double of the 1S overcall and that it would play better in hearts than NT. I was glad I had an extra heart because I didn't have any extra high cards. Most players are afraid of playing a 3-4 fit so I was quite impressed.

The opening lead was the 2C which went to the J and was won with the A.

The trumps were drawn in 3 rounds and declarer recognized that the club spots were very strong so she led the 3C to the 9 forcing East to win the Q. East naturally led a spade which West won and continued and now declarer led one of those club spots throwing a diamond from dummy (a loser on a loser) and could win any return and discard the two losing diamonds on the 2 good clubs making 4 for + 620 which was worth 86%.

Note here, East needed to return a diamond after winning their first club, but their partner did overcall 1S so it is very difficult to fault them for leading the spade.

Notice how important it is to see the club spots and appreciate their value.

#### SINGLE TOPIC SEMINARS – MONDAYS 1-3pm

The Topics listed below are touched upon in the two ACBL texts:

(1) Commonly Used Conventions - (CUC)

(2) More Commonly Used Conventions - MCUC. With each of the below dates we have referred

to the chapter and page of the appropriate text.

• April 3: Strong 2C Opener; systems for responding. This session will focus on Standard

American responses. CUC Chapter 8, page 260.

• April 10: Strong 2C Opener; Control Responses; it is my favorite, and I think the most

effective; not covered in the textbooks.

April 17: Interfering over 1NT opening bid; Cappelletti which is very basic and has very little wriggle room in how to implement. In our general area there are other conventions that are quite popular, and, it is to your benefit to become familiar with these other conventions for when they are used against you; no textbook details.
April 24: Interfering over the opponent's 1NT opening; DONT (Disturbing Opponent's Notrump) and TNT (Touching-Not-Touching); no textbook details.
May 1: You are responder and partner opens 1NT and RHO interferes; what are your options; no textbook details.
