My partner opened 1H and with my values concentrated in the majors I want to make a 3 card limit raise so I responded 1S intending to bid 3H next when my partner jump raised my spades so I decided to bid 4S knowing we were in a 4-4 fit.

The opening lead was a high diamond which I trumped in dummy. The analysis at this point is that in hearts, you should get 4 spades, 5 hearts and 2 clubs for sure for 11 tricks. However in spades you should get 4 spades, 5 hearts, those same 2 clubs and a diamond ruff for 12 tricks.

I decided that it looks too complicated to get 2 diamond ruffs so I led a spade to my hand and took the club finesse. When it lost a spade came back so I won the A and led a spade back to my hand and then a heart to the K in dummy followed by a heart back to my A and when East showed out I got all 5 hearts, 4 natural spades, 1 diamond ruff and 2 clubs making 6 for 81%.

Some pairs did bid 6 and those that made it got 98% and some pairs got 59% for making only 5. There were some that went down in 6, mostly in hearts.

This deal shows why the 4-4 fit plays better than the 5-3 fit.

August 7 - NAP qualifying game Monday F2F only

August 9 & 11 (Wed/Fri), and special bonus open game on Sunday Aug 13 – Silver Linings Week BBO only (silver points)

August 14-17 – Upgraded Club championships – F2F only in honor of CCBC's 1-year anniversary in Orinda. Lots of extra MPs. (Mon, Tues & Thurs)

August 21-24 STaC (silver points) – F2F only (all 3 games in Orinda)

CCBC continues its hybrid schedule with bridge games in person in Orinda and on-line on BBO. CCBC is now hosting games on Mondays (open at 11:15), Tuesdays (299er at 10:00) and Thursdays (999er at 10:30) at the Orinda Masonic Hall, 9 Altarinda Road. Games continue on BBO on Wednesday (open at 10:00) and Friday (open at 10:00).

Reminder: Tuesday's 10 AM bridge game in Orinda is a 299'er game, with the following features:

- 1) A mini-lesson will precede each game, with a review of a hand from the prior week.
- 2) 18 or more boards will typically be played.
- 3) Each player will have the opportunity to ask limited number of bidding questions during the game.
- 4) Games will be stratified by Master Point level; so players are competing with others with comparable experience.
- 5) A player may come with a partner or as a single. (Singles can count on being matched with a partner.)
- 6) Mentoring will be encouraged. An experienced player in the 200-299 MP range playing with one in the 0-50 range will play for <u>free</u>.

The higher the level of bidding the less often these actually occur at the table so it is to your competitive benefit to learn and UNDERSTAND all of these conventions and treatments over time for when they are used against you during the bidding process.

To assist in your learning process Lamorinda Bridge Club hosts a Wednesday afternoon game that will feature a selection of hands from the Monday afternoon topic mixed in with other randomly dealt hands. This is important as often when one learns something new it may be several bridge games before you encounter it at the bridge table, and you may not even recognize it unless you practice it right away to understand it better.

Jerry will entertain special requests of topics and will reserve the right to alter the above schedule accordingly. We will send out updates on the schedule in coming months to announce possible changes.
