This deal demonstrates both bidding and play.

I chose to bid 3N over Easts opening preempt because I know how aggressive he is and I also know that it is likely that my partner would not have enough to balance. I hoped my partner had his share of the outstanding points and he sure did.

West started with the two top diamonds and continued with the 10 which I won and started to cash the hearts. When East showed out I now know West held 1 or 2 spades, 5 hearts, 4 diamonds and 3 or 4 clubs.

At this point the play is quite easy, cash the 5 hearts and then the A and K spades and play the diamond from dummy forcing West to lead a club into my A and Q making 4 for 97%. Without this endplay, making 3 was 88%.

Several pairs were in 4 hearts, most of them going down.

There is another important point here. I cannot make my contract if West had led his partners suit.
