As we near the season to be jolly, it maybe gift-giving time. Some hide presents under a tree, while others celebrate for days, or mail them, and some just don't care.

Not everyone celebrates Christmas, but if you do, December is upon us and winter is near, so clean out your closets and bring out the cheer. Santas, pandas, and all the cute toys, put up a tree and have some tea, if you've got the energy. How about a Hot Toddy! Remember when lots of us celebrated the holiday season with this special drink? It seems to warm our hearts and give us comfort, all in one cup. Hum, I'm getting thirsty; it must be <u>5 o'clock</u> somewhere!

So. It's imperative to be cautious at the bridge table, and don't assume someone can't see your cards OR overhear the bidding and outcome. Even when I groan, make a face, roll my eyes, or take a deep breath, they're all giveaways. Poker face is what we need!!

This deal was played by an opponent that was most likely a novice and didn't understand card combinations.

Having arrived at 4S, it looks like there are not many losers, but there also aren't many winners. On a bad day you could lose 2 spades, 1 heart and 1 club. Therefore, you would need to be careful how you go about playing this hand.

Our declarer won the A diamonds and led a spade to the A followed by a spade towards the dummy covering the J with the Q. East won the K and led his last spade putting declarer in dummy. At this point declarer led the J hearts losing to the K and trumped the diamond return. He then led a club to the K and a club back to the J losing to the Q and he trumped the diamond return ultimately losing his small heart at the end for down 1 and received 7%.

I don't have a problem with his play in spades, but due to the 2D bid by West, they should have most of the remaining points after East shows up with the K spades.

The card combination I am pointing out is in the heart suit. It can never be right to lead the J from dummy because a good defender would cover it and if they don't cover it then it would lose to the K. The right play in the heart suit is to lead towards the J, called an open finesse. If West takes the K then the J hearts is good and you get 3 hearts tricks. You would only lose 1 spade, 1 heart and maybe 1 club but again playing West for the Q you don't lose a club, making 5 for a score of 79%. If you mis-guess clubs and make 4 you would get 43% so you can see that the field was playing it much better than our opponent.

Note also, some of you can spot a club diamond squeeze here.
